

St David

Saint David, the patron saint of Wales, lived in the 6th century and became known for his teachings about fairness, compassion, and humility. He believed that people should live peacefully and help those who were less fortunate.

His monastery in Pembrokeshire was a place where people learned to live simply, farming their own food and caring for the environment. He was also known for performing miracles, such as making the ground rise beneath him while preaching so that everyone could see and hear him clearly.

Saint David's message of kindness and equality still inspires people today. He encouraged his followers to avoid greed and to focus on what truly mattered: helping others and being grateful. Each year, on March 1st, Wales celebrates Saint David's Day, a time to remember his teachings and Welsh culture. People wear daffodils and leeks, listen to traditional music, and take pride in their heritage. In some areas, special church services are held, and children take part in school performances honouring Saint David's legacy.
