Oystermouth Castle

Oystermouth Castle is a grand stone castle that sits on a hill in the seaside town of **Mumbles**, near Swansea. It was first built around 1106, during the time of the **Normans**.

The Normans built castles to show their power and to protect their land. Oystermouth Castle had thick stone walls, tall towers, and a large wooden gate. From the top of the castle walls, guards could watch for enemies coming by land or by sea.

In the 13th century, the castle was made bigger and stronger. More towers were added and a beautiful chapel was built. The chapel still has stained-glass windows which tell stories through coloured glass.

Today, Oystermouth Castle is a place where many people visit.

Schools often organise trips there. Children can climb the towers, walk along the battlements, and imagine what life was like in medieval times. The castle also holds events such as plays and history talks to teach people about the past.

If you visit, you will learn about the people who lived there and how they protected their castle!

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- Normans people from Normandy in France who invaded Britain
- Protection keeping safe from harm
- Battlements the top of the castle walls where guards walked
- Stained-glass windows colourful windows that tell stories
- Chapel— a small church inside the castle
- History talks events where experts tell stories about the past.
