

# Welsh Gov Winter Fuel Support Scheme

— £200 one-off cash payment per household if directly responsible for paying fuel bills and in receipt of:

Job Seeker's Allowance / Employment and Support Allowance – either income based/related or contributory/new-style

Income Support Universal Credit

Working Tax Credits Child Tax Credits

Council Tax Reduction Scheme Pension Credit

Carer's Allowance (including underlying entitlement)

Personal Independence Payment\* Disability Living Allowance\*

Attendance Allowance\* Armed Forces Independence Payment\*

Constant Attendance Allowance\* War Pension Mobility Supplement\*

\*(or someone in household is in receipt of)

- Scheme open until 28/02/23
- Not automatic need to apply help is available if unable to complete form

# Welsh Gov help with the cost of living

- Cost of living payment discretionary scheme
  - Administered by council benefits team:
  - £150 if household not eligible under main scheme and:
    - 100% Council tax exemption: severe mentally impaired; 'granny flats'; care leavers under 18; liable person in care home; absent due to providing personal care; student studying elsewhere
    - All residents under 18 Disability band reduction
    - needed to register by 31/01/23 if missed deadline being processed through CT account or contact customer services team
  - £150 payment in addition to main scheme if:
    - Swansea Council Tenant and not in receipt of Housing Benefit or Universal Credit housing costs
  - £28 payment in addition to main scheme but not one Alertawe above and in Council Tax band A or B

# Welsh Gov help with the cost of living

### Fuel Bank Foundation

- funding to the Fuel Bank Foundation
- voucher scheme for emergency top up of prepayment meters
- will also provide direct support to eligible households living off the gas grid, which are reliant on heating oil and liquid gas

### Discretionary Assistance Fund - Emergency winter fuel support for off grid fuel costs

- available until the end of March 2023
- Emergency Assistance Payments (EAPs) to help off-gas households suffering financial hardship top-up oil and LPG

Swansea Council

- Apply through partnership agency only
  - Oil payment for up to £250 one over 12 months
  - LP Gas payment for up to £70 up to 3 over 12 months

# **Energy Price Guarantee**

- A cap on dual fuel energy bills of £2,500 per year – based on typical usage
  - Energy bills have nearly doubled the Ofgem
     Price Cap last winter was £1,277
- From 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 the cap on a typical bill rises to £3,000/year
  - Further 20% increase
  - No £400 universal support = 43% increase
  - expected to stay at this level until 31 March 2024

# **UK Gov Cost of Living Support**

### Energy Bills Support Scheme

- £400 grant for all households with a domestic electricity meter
- Payment credited to account/meter/pre-payment voucher over 6 months from October 22 – check your post/emails!

# Energy Bills Support Scheme Alternative Funding (EBSS Alternative Funding)

- People without a direct relationship to a domestic energy supplier, (eg some care home residents / living in park homes / off grid) will receive a £400 discount on their fuel bills
- Need to apply (no further details yet)

### Alternative Fuel Payment (AFP)

- £200 to help those households who use alternative fuels such as biomass or heating oil
- If on mains domestic electricity through supplier in February
- If not need to apply directly

# **UK Gov Cost of Living Payments**

- From Spring 2023:
  - £900 Cost of Living Payment for meanstested benefit / tax credit claimants
    - £301 Spring 2023
    - £300 Autumn 2023
    - £299 Spring 2024
  - -£150 Disability Payment Summer 2023
  - £300 Pensioner Payment Winter 2023/4(on top of Winter Fuel Payment)

(should be paid automatically and qualifying period details not yet announced)

# Money

- Emergency Assistance Payment Discretionary Assistance Fund
  - Short-term emergency help if in extreme financial hardship
  - Until end of March 23 can have max 5 payments if affected by covid / removal of £20 UC uplift (on UC & in financial hardship)

# Child Trust Funds

- CTF's were provided to all children born in the UK whose parents were awarded Child Benefit between 01/09/2002 and 02/01/2011.
- HMRC put money in and parents could add to the fund
- When child turns 18 they can access their fund
  - the first funds matured in September 2020

# Food

### Healthy Start Card

- replaced healthy start vouchers for people at least 10 weeks pregnant or have at least one child under 4
- prepaid card topped up every 4 weeks to buy milk, formula, fruit and vegetables at shops displaying a Mastercard® symbol
  - Pregnant or child 1-4 = £4.25pw
  - Child under 1 = £8.50pw
  - No two-child limit
- To qualify for the Healthy Start scheme you must be and be in receipt of:

Child Tax Credit (income under £16,190pa) Income Support

Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance Pension Credit (the child addition)

Universal Credit (net earnings under £408pm)

or

under 18 and pregnant receiving the 4 week Working Tax Credit run-on over 10 weeks pregnant and receiving income-related Employment and Support Allowance

have no recourse to public funds, your child under 4 is a British citizen and your family earns less than £408 per month after tax.

### Welsh Water

- <u>www.dwrcymru.com/en/support-with-bills</u> or ring to request help on 0800 052 0145.
- The <u>Helpu tariff</u> caps domestic water bills to £266.47pa (water and sewage) for people on means-tested benefits and a low household income
- The <u>Watersure tariff</u> puts a cap on domestic water bills if you have or have requested a water meter and is set at £374.01 for April 22 to March 23 for people on means-tested or disability benefits with 3+ children or health problems resulting in higher water use
- The <u>Customer Assistance Fund</u> to clear arrears of your water bill if you are in severe financial hardship as long as you keep to a payment plan.

Warm Wales a community interest company to alleviate fuel poverty

### Healthy Homes, Healthy People

 advice ranging from energy-saving advice to fuel debt assistance, home safety advice to advice on your benefit entitlement.

### Gas Connection Grants

- If changing to gas central heating will improve the energy rating or your home and reduce your bills
- Home owner/private renter and entitled to means-tested benefits or are a social tenant and spend a high proportion of your disposable household income on fuel.

# **Housing Costs**

 Housing Benefit and Universal Credit housing costs do not always cover the rent – first check if receiving full benefit entitlement

### Discretionary Housing Payments

- If in receipt of Housing Benefit or UC claim includes housing costs and the amount does not cover your full rent
- This could be because the rate of the local housing allowance for private sector tenancies is less than actual rent, the bedroom tax or the benefit cap or in hardship and are at risk of losing your home.
- can also apply for help with moving costs to more affordable or suitable housing.
