Pod Pili Pala have been thinking about fairness in everyday life. Through stories, discussions, and role-play, they have explored what it means to be fair and how we can show kindness and respect to others. They have also explored the concept of fairness in storytelling, thinking about how different characters are treated and discussing whether they believe certain outcomes are fair.

Pod Pengwin have been investigating the history of local fairs and fayres. They have researched how these gatherings have evolved over time and even designed their own modern-day fair attractions. As part of their learning, they have also explored the impact of fairground rides on forces and motion, using scientific experiments to understand how rides work.

Pod Pysgodyn have been learning about fair trade, discovering where our food and goods come from and how fair pricing impacts farmers and communities across the world. They have created posters to promote fairness in trade and responsible consumer choices. They also took part in a real-life trading activity to see how fair pricing can affect both producers and consumers.

They have written persuasive pieces about the importance of fairness in different aspects of life. Inspired by their learning, they have also started drafting letters to real-world organisations to advocate for fairness and equality in modern society.
