Where is Llanrhidian?

Llanrhidian is a coastal village in North Gower. It sits beside the salt marsh and the Loughor Estuary. The area is part of the Gower Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The Church

The village church is called St Rhidian and St Illtyd's. It was built over 700 years ago. The tower was once used to watch for danger. Inside, you can find the "Leper Stone," an old Viking carving.

The School

Llanrhidian Primary School teaches children aged 3 to 11. It's a friendly school with outdoor learning and village activities.

What is in the village?

The village has homes, a shop, a pub, a play park and a hall. Some of the buildings are very old and made of stone.

Nature and Wildlife

You can find birds, sheep and Gower ponies near the marsh. Many people enjoy going for walks and looking at the views.

What is the weather like?

Llanrhidian's weather changes often. It can be sunny, windy, or rainy, especially near the coast. The sea air makes it feel fresh and cool.
